Historic Meeting Convenes in Rome

In November 2010, Sister Inmaculada Fukasawa, General Superior of

the Handmaids, convoked an historic meeting. All the sisters in ministries of leadership in the Congregation gathered in Rome to reflect on the topic, Government ad edificationem, (government for upbuilding the Handmaid community.)

meeting. The theme to be pondered was, The Eucharist forms us. Reflecting on the Eucharist verbs - took, blessed, broke and gave, we explored and articulated a Handmaid pedagogy of formation. We were deeply grateful for the 130 young Handmaids throughout the world who are on the road to becoming finally professed.

Throughout the meetings, the mix of Handmaids nationalities offered the joyous confirmation to all of our unity in essentials and diversity in local applications. Sister Dorothy's comment speaks to this reality: "Handmaids are truly becoming one universal body for mission, as Saint Raphaela Mary envisioned. Today in Handmaid life, universality is not just a catch word; it is a reality in which respect and inclusion direct how we are with each other and with the great variety of peoples."

General Team Visits U.S.A.

The Handmaids of the Sacred Heart of Jesus recently welcomed Superior General Sister Inmaculada Fukasawa, acj, and two of her assistants, Sister Nélida Leguen, acj, and Sister Gabriela Espinosa, acj for a visit to the U.S.A. province. During their two-week stay, the Sisters traveled to each of the Handmaid communities, including Atlanta and Athens, Georgia; Miami, Florida; and Haverford, Philadelphia, and Wyncote, Pennsylvania.

A visit by the General team occurs at least once every ten years. The visit

is intended for mutual support, to encourage the living out of the Sisters' vocations fully and to invigorate their ministries. Sister Inmaculada gave the Handmaids in the States the joyful opportunity to hear about Handmaid happenings throughout the world. This mutual sharing of life and mission deepens their union of minds and hearts and strengthens their belonging to a universal community.

Following the visit, Sister Inmaculada reported that she was "pleased to see how the Sisters strive to respond in the spirit of our charism to the challenges presented by society." Recognizing their sense of social responsibility, she noted the collaboration of the Sisters with diocesan social service programs, with at-risk families and with those in need. She also noted the "highly esteemed" Ancillae-Assumpta Academy, acknowledging its recent national award, and the ministry at St. Raphaela Center, calling the Sisters "truly apostolic." She was encouraged by the young women in the Novitiate and Postulantship. Regarding the senior Sisters she remarked, "I was impressed by some of the elderly Sisters who dedicate themselves with great enthusiasm to the service of


The visit of the General Team was a blessing in that it empowered the Sisters and their lay collaborators to rekindle their lives of joyful and humble service.

Simply, yet poignantly, Sr. Oanh Vo shares her experience of entering the Handmaid Novitiate:

"After living with the Handmaids of the Sacred Heart of Jesus for roughly a year, I entered the Novitiate on November 27, 2010 in response to God's continual invitation to follow Him in the footsteps of St. Raphaela Mary. In front of the Blessed Sacrament and in the presence of my parents, and all the sisters, I was officially welcomed into the Handmaid family. My eyes filled with tears as I was overwhelmed by love, joy, and gratitude to God and to those who have touched my life. My life, my vocation, and my new family are but pure gifts, generously given by the God of love. The only proper response to this immense love is to offer my entire being to be God's instrument.

Although I feel like I have known the sisters for many years, this stage is only the beginning of a journey of lifetime discernment and formation as a Handmaid. Lovingly described by my uncle, a priest with the Society of the Divine Word, as "a time of desert experience" and "a long honeymoon with Jesus", this 2-year Novitiate is truly a special period for me to deepen my love for God and to know the Handmaids more intimately. In spite of the uncertain future, of my doubts, fears, and many limitations, I am joyously trying to live in the present moment of grace, knowing that God's unconditional love for me is my light and strength. It is God's invitation for me to "be still and know that I am God" (Ps 46:11). I strive to move forward on this journey with my dear Handmaid companions each day, and let God do the rest."


